- 4. Be creative and have fun with this project. This is your opportunity to showcase your imagination and artistic talents. You can choose to create your graphic novel using the attached template or digitally using software such as Adobe Illustrator, Procreate, or Canva. Whichever method you decide, please ensure that it is neat and legible.


